We have come to the end of another remarkable academic year 2019-20. It is with utmost pleasure and pride that I stand before this august gathering to present the 16<sup>th</sup> Annual report of NEMS. The progress of this institution is certainly due to the excellent support from the management and the team work of my colleagues and students and of course the immense co-operation from parents. Last session befittingly substantiated that NEMS continues to stride for and strive steadily on its journey to all-round excellence. The consistent expansions of its infrastructure widening horizons are few milestones in this journey undertaken. In the brief 16 years of its existence NEMS has established itself as a premier institution of learning providing quality education.

I wish to begin with our performance on the academic front. Achieving academic excellence is at the heart of our endeavour as educators, academic achievement reflect a demonstrated ability to perform to the best of one’s ability by developing one’s intellectual potential and skills with diligence and ardour. Students find it fascinating as they engage in a creative process which connects an art form and other subjects and meet evolving objectives in both.

We had a year full of different celebrations. Starting from World Environment day children participated in International Day of Yoga, Blood donor day, Reading week, World population day, Quit India Day, Independence day, Teachers day,

The students are given ample opportunities to exhibit their talents by encouraging them to participate in various activities.
